Attributing worth to human beings is accepting on faith and acting as if each person has within himself or herself the possibility for kindness, fairness, joy, and the capacity to create ethical relationships. Given this capacity for goodness each person deserves to be treated with dignity."

Over time people have tried to put a value on human life. After the attacks of 9-11 Washington attorney Kenneth Feinberg had to assign a value to the lives that were lost that day. The law required that he give more money to the stockbroker, the bond trader and the banker than to the waiter, the policeman, the fireman and the soldier at the Pentagon. Our system of justice has always been based upon this idea — that compensation for death should be directly related to the financial circumstances of each victim. However after meeting with the families of the police and fireman the heroes of 9-11 he began to change his mind. "Trained in the law, I had always accepted that no two lives were worth the same in financial terms. But now I found the law in conflict with my growing belief in the equality of all life."
